

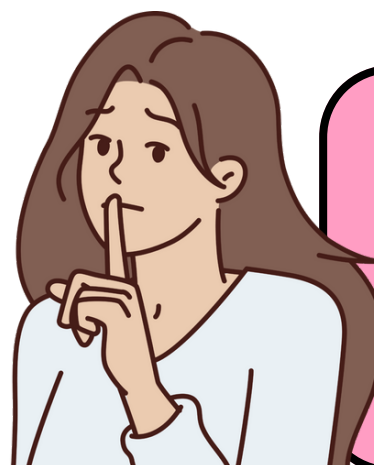


KNOW YOUR RIGHTS



IF YOU'RE STOPPED/ TAKEN BY OFFICERS OR FEDERAL AGENTS

- You have the right to **remain silent**. If you are a minor, you need the presence of a parent. Give the card to the agent or officer. *(see last slide)*
- **Stay calm**. Do not run, argue, resist, or obstruct the police.
- **Ask, "Am I under arrest?"**
 - If yes, ask why.
 - If no, ask "Am I free to leave?"
 - If yes, calmly walk away
- **You do not have to consent to a search** of yourself or your belongings
- **Do not sign anything** without speaking to your attorney
- You have a right for a local phone call. The police cannot listen if you call your attorney.
- **You have the right to a lawyer.**

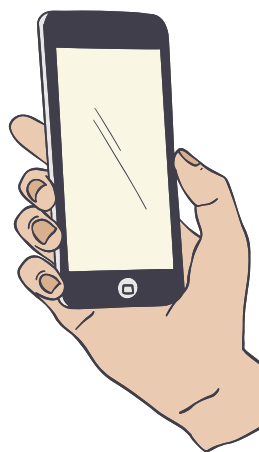

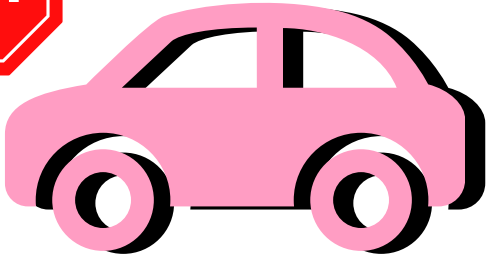

KNOW YOUR RIGHTS



IF YOU'RE STOPPED IN YOUR CAR



- Stop the car in a safe place as quickly as possible. **Turn off the car**, turn on the internal light, **slightly crack the window open**, place your hands on the steering wheel.



- **Upon request**, show the police your driver's license, registration and proof of insurance.



- If an officer or immigration agent asks to search your car, **you can refuse**. But if police believe a car contains evidence of a crime, **they can search with your consent**.



- Both drivers and passengers have the right to **remain silent**. If you are a passenger, you can also ask if you are free to leave. If yes, silently leave.

- Do not resist
- You have the right to **remain silent, don't sign** anything you don't understand without speaking to an attorney.
- Do not discuss your immigration status with anyone but your lawyer
- Know your **immigration number** ("A" number) and share with family.

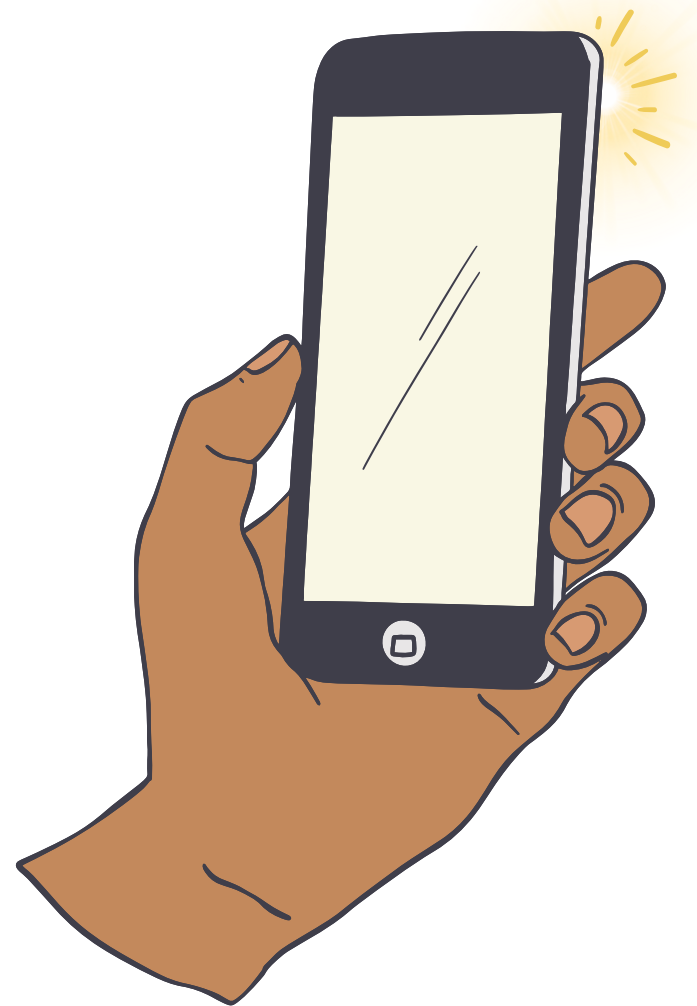


KNOW YOUR RIGHTS



IF YOU FEEL YOUR RIGHTS HAVE BEEN VIOLATED

- You can film but do not engage physically. **Write down everything** you remember and witness. Details are very important: time, location, patrol car numbers, describe police office officers or federal agents
- You have the right to **file a written complaint** with the agency's internal affairs and civilian complaint board.



KNOW YOUR RIGHTS



TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Please be informed that I am choosing to exercise my right to remain silent and the right to refuse to answer your questions, based on my 5th Amendment right under the United States Constitution. If I am detained by an ICE official or by a police officer, I request to contact an attorney immediately. I am also exercising my right to refuse to sign anything until I consult with my attorney. I would like to contact a lawyer at this number:

If you are at the door of my home, I do not give your permission to enter my home based on my 4th Amendment rights under the United States Constitution. I will only permit you to enter my home if you show me a warrant signed by a judge or magistrate. If you have such a warrant, please tell me and then slide it under the door.



CONOZCA SUS DERECHOS



SI LO DETIENEN O LO LLEVAN OFICIALES O AGENTES FEDERALES

- **Tiene derecho a guardar silencio.** Si es menor de edad, necesita la presencia de uno de sus padres. Entregue la tarjeta al agente o funcionario.
(ver última diapositiva)
- **Mantén la calma.** No corras, discutas, te resistas ni obstruyas a la policía.
- **Pregunte "¿Estoy arrestado?"**
 - Si la respuesta es sí, pregunte por qué.
 - Si la respuesta es no, pregunte "¿puedo irme?"
 - Si es así, aléjate con calma.
- **No tienes que dar tu consentimiento** para que te registren a ti mismo o a tus pertenencias.
- **No firmes nada que no entienda** sin hablar con un abogado
- Tiene derecho a una llamada local. La policía no podrá escucharle si llama a su abogado.
- **Usted tiene derecho a un abogado.**

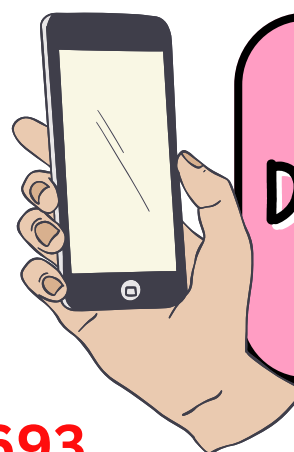

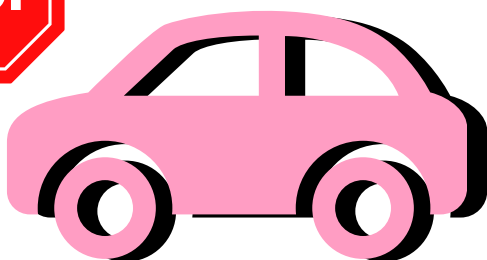

CONOZCA SUS DERECHOS



SI TE DETIENEN EN TU COCHE



- Detenga el coche en un lugar seguro lo antes posible. Apague el coche, encienda la luz interior, abra ligeramente la ventanilla y coloque las manos en el volante.



- Si se lo solicitan, muestre a la policía su licencia de conducir, registro y comprobante de seguro.



- Si un oficial o agente de inmigración le pide registrar su auto, puede negarse. Pero si la policía cree que un auto contiene evidencia de un delito, puede registrarlo con su consentimiento.



- Tanto los conductores como los pasajeros tienen derecho a guardar silencio. Si usted es pasajero, también puede preguntar si puede irse. Si es así, retírese en silencio.

- No te resistas
- Tienes derecho a permanecer en silencio, no firmes nada que no entiendas. Sin hablar con un abogado
- No discuta su estatus migratorio con nadie más que con su abogado.
- Conozca su número de inmigración (número “A”) y compártalo con su familia.

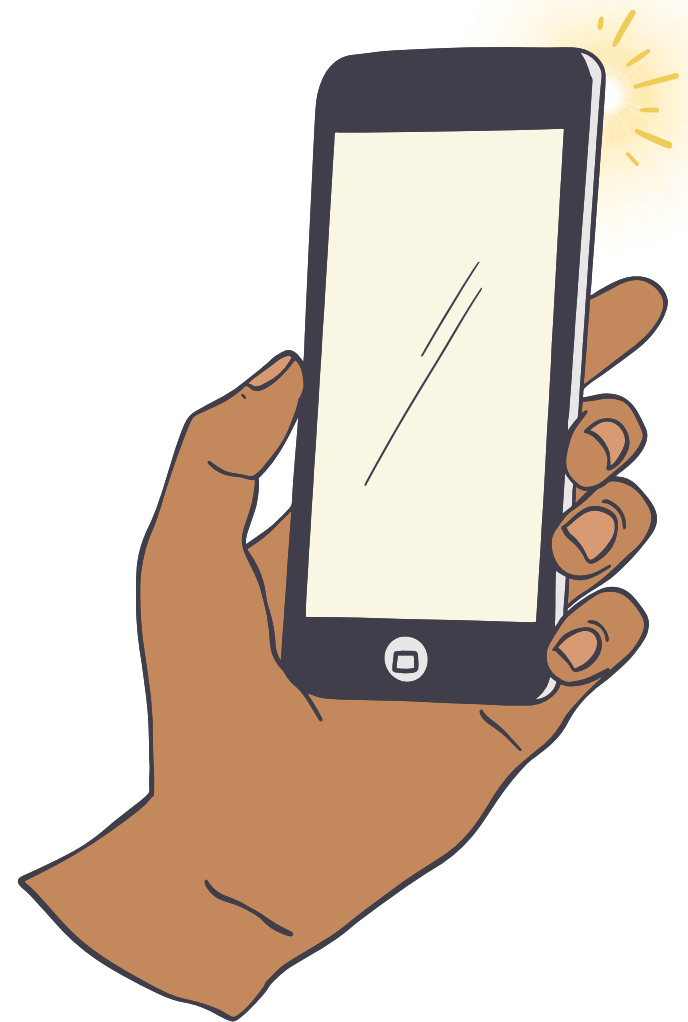


CONOZCA SUS DERECHOS



SI SIENTE QUE SUS DERECHOS HAN SIDO VIOLADOS

- Puedes filmar, pero no te involucres físicamente. Anota todo lo que recuerdes y presencias. Los detalles son muy importantes: hora, lugar, números de patrulla y descripción de los agentes de policía o federales.
- Tiene derecho a presentar una queja por escrito ante la junta de asuntos internos y quejas civiles de la agencia.



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
